- Wednesday, Oct. 2: **Opening night of the 2019-20 NHL regular season** includes four games: the St. Louis Blues raise the franchise's first Stanley Cup banner prior to their home opener against the Washington Capitals on NBCSN (8 p.m.); the Ottawa Senators visit the Toronto Maple Leafs in the latest installment of the Battle of Ontario on Sportsnet (7 p.m.); the Edmonton Oilers play host to the Vancouver Canucks in an all-Canadian showdown on Sportsnet (10 p.m.); the Vegas Golden Knights open their season at home against the San Jose Sharks on NBCSN (10:30 p.m.) the two Pacific Division rivals have met in each of the last two postseasons.

Thursday, Oct. 3: Panthers D Anton Stralman returns to Tampa Bay for the first time. Stralman recorded 130 points and a +80 rating in 355 regular-season appearances with the Lightning from 2014-15 to 2018-19, and ranks fifth on the franchise's all-time list for points by a defenseman. New York Rangers D Jacob Trouba will face his former team for the first time when the Winnipeg Jets visit Madison Square Garden. Trouba, who the Jets selected with the No. 9 pick in the 2012 NHL Draft, spent his first six NHL seasons with Winnipeg, registering 42-137-179 in 408 regular-season appearances. New York will visit Winnipeg on Feb. 11. Friday, Oct. 4: 2019 NHL Global Series (Chicago Blackhawks at Philadelphia Flyers). O2 Arena in Prague, Czech Republic, will play host to the first of three regular-season games played overseas in 2019-20 (2 p.m.). Saturday, Oct. 5: The Buffalo Sabres face off against the New Jersey Devils at KeyBank Center in Buffalo – the home opener for their 50th anniversary season (7 p.m.). The Washington Capitals play the Carolina Hurricanes in the first meeting between the teams since Carolina overcame a multi-goal deficit in Game 7 of the First Round of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs to eliminate Washington in double-overtime. **Brock McGinn**'s game-winning tally at 11:05 of the second overtime concluded the third-longest Game 7 in League history. Los Angeles Kings head coach Todd McLellan returns to Edmonton for the first time. McLellan served as Oilers head coach from 2015-16 to 2018-19, guiding the team to a 123-119-24 record in the regular season. Wednesday, Oct. 9: The Vancouver Canucks play host to the Los Angeles Kings at Rogers Arena in Vancouver – the home opener for their 50th anniversary season (10 p.m.; NBCSN, SNP). The date and opponent are the same as the franchise's NHL debut in 1970-71. New Jersey Devils F Wayne Simmonds returns to Philadelphia for the first time since the Flyers traded him to the Nashville Predators on Feb. 25. Simmonds recorded 203-175-378 in 584 regular-season contests with Philadelphia from 2011-12 to 2018-19 - no Flyers skater scored more goals than Simmonds over that span. Thursday, Oct. 10: On this date in 1987, Hartford Whalers C Doug Jarvis extended his NHL-record consecutive games played streak to 964 games. It was the final game of his career, ending an unprecedented run that began with his League debut on Oct. 8, 1975. Saturday, Oct. 12: Arizona Coyotes F Phil Kessel is expected to skate in his 1,000th regular-season game. Entering the 2019-20 season, Kessel has appeared in 774 consecutive regular-season contests (Nov. 3, 2009 – April 6, 2019) – the eighth longest Ironman streak in NHL history. Thursday, Oct. 17: The New York Rangers visit the New Jersey Devils (7 p.m.) in what could be the first time the top two picks from the 2019 NHL Draft - New Jersey's Jack Hughes (No. 1) and New York's Kaapo **Kakko** (No. 2) – face each other in the regular season: Saturday, Oct. 19: The Boston Bruins visit the Toronto Maple Leafs in the first half of a home-and-home series – the first meeting between the teams since Boston eliminated Toronto in a First Round, seven-game series for the second consecutive postseason. The two teams meet again three days later, in Boston on Oct. 22.

Thursday, Oct. 24: Dallas Stars F **Corey Perry** will face his former team for the first time when the Anaheim Ducks visit Dallas in what is expected to be the veteran forward's 1,000th career regular-season game. Perry, who spent his first 14 seasons with the Ducks and helped the franchise win its first Stanley Cup in 2007, ranks among the top three in team history in goals (372; 2nd), assists (404; 3rd) and points (776; 3rd). Dallas visits Anaheim Jan. 9.

The Washington Capitals visit the Edmonton Oilers (9 p.m.) in the first of two meetings between last season's two 50-goal scorers: Washington's **Alex Ovechkin** and Edmonton's **Leon Draisaitl**.

Saturday, Oct. 26: **2019 Tim Hortons Heritage Classic** (Calgary Flames at Winnipeg Jets). Mosaic Stadium in Regina, Sask. – home of the CFL's Saskatchewan Roughriders – will be the fifth regular-season outdoor game in the Heritage Classic series and first since 2016 at Investors Group Field in Winnipeg (10 p.m.; HNIC, NBCSN).

A rematch of the 2019 Stanley Cup Final – a seven-game series that saw the St. Louis Blues capture the franchise's first Stanley Cup – will see the defending champion visit the Boston Bruins in a game televised nationally in the U.S. (7 p.m., NBCSN).

- Monday, Nov. 4: Edmonton Oilers head coach **Dave Tippett** will face his former team for the first time when the Oilers play host to the Arizona Coyotes at Rogers Place. Tippett served as Coyotes head coach for eight seasons, from 2009-10 to 2016-17, guiding the team to a 282-257-83 record in the regular season and a trip 2012 Conference Finals. The two teams will meet in Arizona on Nov. 24.
- Tuesday, Nov. 5:Boston Bruins D Zdeno Chara is expected to skate in his 1,500th career regular-season contest.
He would become the 21st player (sixth defenseman) to reach the 1,500-game milestone.
- Friday, Nov. 8: **2019 NHL Global Series** (Tampa Bay Lightning at Buffalo Sabres). Ericsson Globe in Stockholm, Sweden, will host the first of an overseas home-and-home series between the teams (2 p.m.).

Vancouver Canucks D **Tyler Myers** returns to Winnipeg for the first time. Myers recorded 29-85—114 in 270 regular-season games with the Jets from 2014-15 to 2018-19.

Saturday, Nov. 9: **2019 NHL Global Series** (Buffalo Sabres at Tampa Bay Lightning). The final of three regularseason games to be contested in Europe this season will take place at Ericsson Globe in Stockholm, Sweden (1 p.m.).

Chicago Blackhawks D **Olli Maatta** returns to Pittsburgh for the first time. Maatta, who spent his first six NHL seasons with the Penguins after they selected him with the No. 22 pick in the 2012 NHL Draft, helped Pittsburgh capture back-to-back Stanley Cups in 2016 and 2017.

Friday, Nov. 15: Hockey Hall of Fame Game (Boston Bruins at Toronto Maple Leafs; 7 p.m.).

Saturday, Nov. 16:	First of two 15-game slates of the 2019-20 season (also final day of regular season on Saturday, April 4). This marks the 17th 15-game day in League history – only the Columbus Blue Jackets are idle.
	Los Angeles Kings F Jeff Carter is expected to skate in his 1,000th career regular-season game.
Monday, Nov. 18:	Hockey Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony (Toronto, Ont.): Inductees: Guy Carbonneau, Vaclav Nedomansky, Hayley Wickenheiser and Sergei Zubov (Player category); Jim Rutherford, Jerry York (Builder category); Frank Brown, Jim Hughson (Media honorees).

	The 2019-20 regular season surpasses the quarter-mark on a 13-game day.
	Tampa Bay Lightning F Pat Maroon returns to St. Louis for the first time since winning the Stanley Cup with his hometown Blues. Maroon contributed a pair of game-winning goals during St. Louis' run to the championship, including a memorable double-overtime winner in Game 7 of the Second Round against the Dallas Stars to propel the Blues to the Western Conference Final.
Saturday, Nov. 23:	Toronto Maple Leafs D Tyson Barrie and F Alexander Kerfoot return to Colorado for the first time. Barrie, who ranked seventh among NHL defensemen with 14-45—59 in 2018-19, holds the Avalanche franchise record for points by a blueliner (75-232—307 in 484 GP).
	Additionally, Colorado Avalanche F Nazem Kadri will face his former team for the first time when Toronto visits Colorado. Kadri spent his first 10 NHL seasons with the Maple Leafs, totaling 161-196—357 in 561 regular-season games. Colorado visits Toronto 11 days later on Dec. 4.
Monday, Nov. 25:	Minnesota Wild F Mats Zuccarello returns to New York for the first time since the Rangers traded him to the Dallas Stars on Feb. 23. Zuccarello recorded 113-239—352 in 509 regular-season games with the Rangers from 2010-11 to 2018-19 – the highest assist total and second-highest point total of any Rangers skater over that span.
Tuesday, Nov. 26:	NHL Founders Day (1917). Six teams are in action on the 102nd anniversary of the League's founding, including an all-Original Six matchup between the Boston Bruins and Montreal Canadiens (7 p.m.).
Friday, Nov. 29:	2019 NHL Thanksgiving Showdown (New York Rangers at Boston Bruins, 1 p.m., NBC). The annual showdown highlights a 12-game slate to cap the U.S. Thanksgiving holiday.

Sunday, Dec. 1:	Signing deadline for Group 2 free agents (5 p.m.).
	Minnesota Wild F Mikko Koivu is expected to skate in his 1,000th career regular-season game. Koivu, who holds franchise records for games played, assists and points, will become the first player to appear in 1,000 games for the franchise.
Tuesday, Dec. 3:	The Vancouver Canucks will induct Alex Burrows into the team's Ring of Honour prior to hosting the Ottawa Senators (10 p.m.). A fan-favorite during his time in Vancouver, Burrows recorded 193-191—384 in 822 regular-season games with the franchise and added 19-15—34 in 70 postseason appearances.

Thursday, Dec. 5:	New York Rangers F Artemi Panarin returns to Columbus for the first time. Panarin compiled 55-114—169 in 160 regular-season appearances with the Blue Jackets from 2017-18 to 2018-19, setting single-season franchise records for assists and points last season (28-59—87 in 79 GP).
Friday, Dec. 6:	Arizona Coyotes F Phil Kessel returns to Pittsburgh for the first time. Kessel posted 303 points (110 goals, 193 assists) in 328 regular-season games with the Penguins across four seasons and added 20-36—56 in 65 postseason appearances – helping Pittsburgh capture back-to-back Stanley Cups in 2016 and 2017.
Saturday, Dec. 7:	Florida Panthers G Sergei Bobrovsky will face his former team for the first time when the Columbus Blue Jackets visit Florida. In seven seasons with Columbus, Bobrovsky set franchise marks for wins (213) and shutouts (33) while capturing the Vezina Trophy twice (2012-13 and 2016-17). Florida visits Columbus on Dec. 31.
	New Jersey Devils D P.K. Subban returns to Nashville for the first time. Subban recorded 35-95—130 in 211 games with the Predators from 2016-17 to 2018-19 and helped the franchise reach the Stanley Cup Final for the first time in 2017.
Sunday, Dec. 8:	The first of two meetings in 2019-20 between Edmonton Oilers C Connor McDavid and Buffalo Sabres C Jack Eichel , the top two picks from the 2015 NHL Draft, takes place as the Oilers play host to the Sabres (8 p.m.). The teams face off in Buffalo on Jan. 2.
Dec. 9-10:	NHL Board of Governors meeting (Pebble Beach, Calif.).
Thursday, Dec. 12:	U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Induction in Washington, D.C. Inductees: Gary Bettman, Brian Gionta, Neal Henderson, Tim Thomas and Krissy Wendell. Lester Patrick recipient: Dr. Jack Blatherwick.
	San Jose Sharks F Joe Thornton is expected to skate in his 1,600th career regular-season game. He would become the 12th player in NHL history to reach the 1,600-game milestone.
Saturday, Dec. 14:	San Jose Sharks D Marc-Edouard Vlasic is expected to skate in his 1,000th career regular- season game. Vlasic, who has spent his entire NHL career with San Jose, would become the third player to appear in 1,000 games with the franchise (also Patrick Marleau and Joe Thornton).

Philadelphia Flyers head coach Alain Vigneault will face his former team for the first time when the Flyers play host to the New York Rangers. Vigneault served as New York's bench boss from 2013-14 to 2017-18, amassing a 226-147-37 record during the regular season while leading the franchise to the 2014 Stanley Cup Final. The two teams will meet in New York on March 1. Dec. 24-26: Holiday break (no scheduled practices; dressing rooms closed). Dec. 26 - Jan. 5: IIHF World Junior Championship (Ostrava/Trinec, Czech Republic). Calgary Flames G Cam Talbot and F Milan Lucic will return to Edmonton for the first time. Friday, Dec. 27: Talbot appeared in 227 regular-season games for the Oilers across four seasons from 2015-16 to 2018-19, compiling a 104-95-19 record (2.74 GAA, .912 SV%, 12 SO) - ranking fifth on the franchise's all-time wins list. Lucic recorded 39-65-104 in 243 regular-season contests with Edmonton from 2016-17 to 2018-19. Additionally, Edmonton Oilers goaltender **Mike Smith** is set to face his former team for the first time when the Oilers play host to the Flames. Smith posted a 48-38-8 mark across two seasons with Calgary (2.68 GAA, .909 SV%, 5 SO). Edmonton visits Calgary on Jan. 11. Tuesday, Dec. 31: The final day of the 2019 calendar year features 13 games, beginning with two games at 1 p.m. (BOS at NJD and NYI at WSH) and closing with four contests that start at 9 p.m. (PHI at LAK; CHI at CGY; NYR at EDM; STL at ARI). On this date in 1988, Pittsburgh Penguins C Mario Lemieux became the first player in NHL history to score five goals in five different ways. The 2019-20 regular season surpasses the halfway mark on a 12-game day. Thursday, Jan. 2: Monday, Jan. 6: New York Islanders G Semyon Varlamov will face his former team for the first time when the Islanders play host to the Colorado Avalanche.
