ABOUT THE WHL

The Western Hockey League started with just seven teams based in the provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta in 1966. Today, the WHL has representation in all four Western Canadian provinces and the U.S. states of Oregon and Washington. The WHL now consists of 22 member Clubs with 17 based in Canadian markets and five in the U.S. Pacific Northwest.

The WHL is a member of the Canadian Hockey League (CHL) whose membership is comprised of three major junior hockey leagues: Ontario Hockey League (OHL), Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) and the Western Hockey League (WHL). At the conclusion of each League's playoffs, the CHL hosts the Memorial Cup Presented by Kia, a national championship tournament involving each of the three Leagues' Champions and the tournament host.

The WHL is regarded as one of the finest development Leagues in the world today. Each season, the WHL is one of the top Leagues from which players are selected from in the NHL Draft. Currently, 20% of all NHL players are graduates of the WHL. The WHL is also a leading provider of post-secondary scholarships with over 400 scholarships awarded each year to current and graduate WHL players, more than any other League in North America.

ED CHYNOWETH CUP

WHL CHAMPIONS & RECIPIENTS OF 'THE ED CHYNOWETH CUP'

In 1973 Ed Chynoweth was appointed the first full time president of the WHL, and soon after became the first ever president of the Canadian Hockey League, positions he held for over 20 years.

In 2007, the WHL renamed their championship trophy the Ed Chynoweth Cup in recognition of the extraordinary leadership Ed provided to major junior hockey and the game in Canada. Ed, who passed away in April 2008, was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame posthumously in November 2008.

WHL MEDIA SERVICES POLICY 2021-22

MEDIA & SCHEDULES

REGULAR SEASON & PLAYOFFS

All WHL member clubs will be required to comply with the following Media Services Policy, which will apply to all games staged during the 2021-22 WHL Regular Season and Playoffs.

Media Access to Players and other

Team Personnel

Game Day/Night – Players, Coaches and other Team Personnel will be available upon request for media interviews up to 90 minutes before game time.

The dressing rooms of each team are considered restricted access - no access is granted without the permission of the team concerned. Access to the dressing room, by the media or other personnel, is strictly at the discretion of each team.

Exceptions are made for all televised games. Broadcast partners will coordinate with teams involved to secure dressing room access pre-game and during intermissions.

All players requested for post-game interviews must be available (immediately outside the dressing room, or in an area designated by the home team) within 15 minutes following leaving the ice at the conclusion of the game. Should a player be injured or receiving medical treatment following the game, he will not be required to participate in the interview.

A member of the coaching staff of each team must be available to the media for interviews within 15 minutes following the game.

The post-game interview sessions, for team members, must not exceed thirty (30) minutes in duration.

Press Box Seating

The home team must provide a minimum of four (4) seating positions, in press box or other acceptable location, for all visiting accredited media (includes radio broadcast positions).

Practice Sessions

The media shall have access to attend all team practice sessions and game day skates. In the event of a team meeting after a practice sessions, media will be allowed access to the Team Personnel immediately following the conclusion of the meeting.

Visiting Media

Each WHL member club must provide both the home and visiting print media with a dedicated working space with internet access to file stories from. These dedicated spaces (at minimum two), will be shared on a first-come, first served basis for both home and visiting media in attendance.
